Living rooms and shared spaces

- ☐ Furniture, rugs, curtains and lighting.
- ☐ Television, sound system, consoles and electronics.
- ☐ Artwork, mirrors, ornaments, books, instruments or collections.
- ☐ Whole-room photographs plus close-ups of valuable or distinctive items.

Bedrooms and wardrobes

- ☐ Beds, furniture and electronics.
- ☐ Jewellery, watches, handbags and luggage.
- ☐ Clothing grouped sensibly by type and approximate quantity.
- ☐ Items stored under beds, in wardrobes or elsewhere seasonally.

Kitchen and dining

- ☐ Major appliances and identifying labels.
- ☐ Smaller appliances and specialist equipment.
- ☐ Cookware, tableware and valuable sets.
- ☐ Dining furniture and other significant items.

Office, garage, loft, shed and garden

- ☐ Computers, phones, cameras, storage devices and office equipment.
- ☐ Bicycles, tools, lawn equipment and sports/camping gear.
- ☐ Garden furniture, barbecues, ladders and stored household items.
- ☐ Record employer or business-owned items separately.

Evidence for important items

- ☐ Brand, model and serial number where available.
- ☐ Approximate purchase date and cost.

- ☐ Receipt, invoice, guarantee, valuation or certificate.
- ☐ Overview and identifying photographs.
- ☐ Note where the original documents are stored.
